

SNBT Employees Donate over \$1,700 to Local Non-Profit

The Stephenson National Bank & Trust (SNBT) employees take part in varieties of charitable organizations year round. This year has been no different. They stepped up in a big way by donating hundreds of canned goods, and over \$1,700 to St. Vincent DePaul.

Donations have been accumulating since the middle of September. To add more excitement to this year's challenge, the four painted metal fish "Welcoming Walleyes" that adorned the outside of SNBT's Marinette Campus, were raffled off. By the end of the training day, Dan Peterson, SNBT President & CEO fish earned the most money, thus awarding him the pie in the face.
